Letter from Director

Dear Parents,

The staff and I hope that your Christmas was fun and bright, but most importantly that the joyous season was filled with the gifts of Christ's grace, mercy and love for you and your family. Thank you so much for the gift certificates and the other presents. They are very much appreciated!

January is our reading awareness month. On January 4th, when we return from break, we will send home a book worm sheet. We ask that you read one story a day to your child and write the title of the book on the appropriate line. When the book worm is completed, return the form to school so your child can receive a surprise! Please return all book worms by January 28th. Our goal is to promote good reading habits.

Reading to your child provides a valuable educational advantage. Children who are read to do far better in school, as they soak up everything they see and hear. Preschoolers tend to have favorite stories and may request the same book over and over. Repetition is important, as children are beginning their pre-reading skills. Checking their understanding and recall skills at the end of the book should be part of story reading. One thing your child will be doing in Pre-K 4 and kindergarten is sequencing. You can help your child with this skill by asking questions like what happened first, second, and last. When you read to your child you are teaching them much more than just the material you are reading. Reading aloud establishes a close loving bond between a parent and a child that can be forged in no better way.

Please make sure your child is dressed warmly when coming to school and **label all outerwear with their names.**

The children need to go outside at recess to run off some of their energy so we do not keep them inside unless the temperature is below 40 degrees. Cold weather does not make them sick unless they're not dressed appropriately and also there are fewer germs outside. Some of the extra clothes we have for the children in case they have an accident are summer outfits; please remember to send warm outfits.

Next month we will have Open House & Registration. Registration will be held February 1- February 28 and Open House will be on February 3rd at 6pm at the Pre-K 3. Returning students and siblings of existing students are automatically accepted but must turn in a new application and all applicable registration fees. This ensures that we secure your spot. Please share this information with any friends or family that may be interested in registering. Entering children must be 3 by December 31st.

We will be sending home white envelopes on the 28th. Please self address them with parents name and address, place a stamp on them and return to school by the following Monday, the 31st. We will be walking to the Post Office in early February for the children to mail a special Valentine to you.
